


Getting to *Reunion* From Stamford Road

Where is *Reunion* Social Space and Café? Entrance Option Along Stamford Road (next to SMU Campus)





Option 1: via front entrance of Reunion


This is one of the entrances **via stairs** to *Reunion,* facing Stamford road.

This entrance is open from 9am to 6pm daily.

Option 2: via outdoor ramp (accessible route)

The nearest bus stop would be the SMU bus stop (04141).




Option 2: via outdoor ramp (accessible route)

From the bus stop, turn right and follow the path towards Reunion, with the SMU Connexion building on your left.



Option 2: via outdoor ramp (accessible route)

At the crossroad, make a left and continue to the end of the path.

Turn left, follow the path and walk towards the hoarding on the right.

Walk towards the hoarding with the 'WE ARE OPEN' sign and turn left.

Follow this path on the left of the main entrance of Café Brera at Reunion.

Make a right turn at the end of this path to get to the side entrance.

Walk towards the shelter and enter Reunion via the ramp on the right.

This is the ramp entrance to *Reunion,* which can be accessed via Stamford Road or from the main museum.

This entrance is open from 9am to 6pm daily.

Option 3: via museum stairs entrance

This is the entrance **via stairs** to the museum, that is the nearest from the Fort Canning Car Park A, facing Canning Rise.

This entrance is open from 9am to 7pm daily.



Option 3: via museum stairs entrance

Entering from the stairs entrance will bring you to level 3 of the museum. Turn left to take the lift down or take the stairs down to **level 2**.

At level 2, take the escalator or lift down to **level 1**. Follow the rest of the instructions of the sheltered route (option 4).



Option 4: via main museum

This is the main museum entrance and pick up/drop off point, which can be accessed via Canning Rise.

This entrance is open from 9am to 7pm daily.



Option 4: via main museum

Enter the museum from the museum's main entrance via 40 Canning Rise, Singapore 179870 (level 2) and head down to **level 1** via the escalator or lift.




Option 4: via main museum

From the entrance, make a right turn and take the escalator down to level 1.

At the end of the escalator, make a left turn and walk towards the end of walkway.

Head towards the exit door past the *Museum Martket by ABRY.*





Facilities / Features in Reunion

There are five (5) key areas in *Reunion*:

- 1. Memory Lane
- 2. Music Booths
- 3. Activity Area
- 4. Quiet Room
- 5. Café Brera at Reunion



1. Memory Lane

Enter Memory Lane to view virtual exhibitions designed by past participants.

You may also stand in front of the screen to take a picture with your favourite design, or relax on the banquette seats or armchair while viewing the exhibition artworks.

Please be careful not to touch the screen as it is very fragile.

Cushions in the cubicles and footrest under the sofa can be used for better support while sitting on the sofa.

There are roller blinds in this room to create a comfortable space for seniors to recalibrate themselves.

There is also a fidget blanket and museum resources for seniors to engage with, to take a break from the activities outside.
